healthy – (adjective) having good health, not likely to become ill



What's the opposite of "healthy"?

unhealthy

fit – (adjective) healthy and strong because you do regular physical exercise

What's the opposite of "fit"?

unfit

unhealthy unfit

to exercise (verb): *I exercise most evenings.* **exercise** (noun) (do) exercise: *He never does exercise.*

stressed – (adjective) worried and unhappy because you have too much work or too many problems:

I am very stressed at work.
